ceeding great. 5 And entering into the tomb, they saw a young man sitting on the right side, arrayed in white robe; and they were amazed. 6 And he saith unto them, Be not amazed; ye seek Jesus, the Nazarene, who hath been crucified; he is risen, as he said. 7 But go, tell his disciples and Peter, He goeth before you into Galilee; there shall ye see him, as he said unto you. 8 And they went out, and fled from the tomb; for trembling and astonishment had come upon them; and they said nothing to any one; for they were afraid.

9 Now when he was risen early on the first day of the week, he appeared first to Mary Magdalene, from whom he had cast out seven demons. 10 She went and told them that had been with him, as they mourned and wept. 11 And they, when they heard that he was alive, and had been seen of her, disbelieved.

12 And after these things he was manifested in another form unto two of them, as they walked, on their way into the country. 13 And they went
