Now, as we near the end of our Senior year, let us take just one quick backward glance over our four years of high school.

September 5, 1950, brought the beginning day of our Freshman year as one hundred and five mystified students trouped through the doors of our alma mater, Tell City High School. All of us were surrounded by the upper classmen offering to sell us the study hall books, physical education books, etc. , which they had been persuaded to buy when they were "green freshmen" JUST LIKE US. Selecting our schedules and learning our way around seemed to be our greatest worries for the first few days.

During the first week of school, Mr, Lee, our principal, called us together for our first class meeting to elect sponsors and officers. The officers elected were Ronald Lautner, President; James Stephens, Vice-President; and Paul Mills, Secretary-Treasurer. Marcella Tanner and Jerry Hoesli were freshman Representatives to the Student Council. For class sponsors we chose Mr. Duane Dolezal and Miss Thelma Terry.

After having learned our way around we sponsored a Sock Hop on November 21, 1950. This was held in the Tell City High School Auditorium and music was by a Dixie Davis Combo. A class picnic was held at Lincoln City Park after we had finally paid our class dues at the end of that year.

Exactly one hundred students returned for their sophomore year; only five less than the previous year.

To begin the activities for our sophomore year we chose Mrs. Julia Graves Roberson and Mr. Andrew Taff to guide us. We also elected Ronald Lautner, President; Patricia Poehlein, Vice-President; and Robert Ettensohn, Secretary-Treasurer. Our Student Council Representatives were Marilyn Miller, Larry Krieg, and John Maurice Dauby.

When October rolled around, we were confronted with the selection of class jackets. The traditional red and white jackets were ordered with a variation or our own: a red and white corduroy lined with silver-gray water repellent fabric.

On February 20, 1952, we sponsored a well-attended Sadie Hawkins Dance at the Moose Home. Music was by a Dixie Davis Combo with Robert Kreager as vocalist. Votes were sold who attended for the purpose of electing a queen, Anormalee Splater, and a king, Bill Jones.

The conclusion of our sophomore year found us at Lincoln City Park enjoying the usual picnic.

The year of 1952-53 brought eighty-five industrious students back to attend their junior year.

At the first class meeting of that school year we selected Mr. Robert Kreager and Mr. James Roos as our sponsors to direct our activities. Also at this meeting we close as class officers: Robert Ettensohn, President; Dennis Kessens, Vice-President; and Connie Collins, Secretary-Treasurer. Elected as Student Council Representatives were Carolyn Hess, Robert Seibert, and Wilma Winter.

In October of that year we ordered the customary class rings which were received in December. These rings represented all of the hard work which we had done in our high school days and were worn proudly, and will be for many years to come.

Also in October the class presented the annual Junior Play. "Our Town", a drama, was directed by Mr. Robert Kreager before a very large and appreciative audience.

As other means of raising money we sold red and white "TC" ties and basketball schedule pencils; we sponsored a movie; conducted the Junior Amateur Hour and the Junior Carnival; and directed a Junior Magazine Sale campaign.

To climax our first three years of high school, the Junior-Senior Banquet was held at the K of C Home. The Junior-Senior Prom was held at the Country Club with music by Dixie Davis and vocals by Mr. Robert Kreager.

Concluding our junior year was a picnic at Lincoln City Park which we enjoyed very much.
Seventy-two determined seniors returned to realize their goal of receiving their diplomas.
Miss Calla Black and Mr. Hugh Thrasher were chosen as our senior sponsors, Class officers were, Robert Ettensohn, President; Robert Seibert, Vice-President; Allen Kast, Secretary; and Ronald Lautner, Treasurer. Wilfred Zoll was elected Student Council Representative,

The first major undertaking of this, our senior year, was the annual Magazine Sale. There was great competition between the two teams, the or ange and the green, into which the class was divided. The orange team won with Robert Harpeneau and Gary Poehlein as high salesmen. Bruce Hinton and John Maurice Daubs were high salesmen for the opposing green team, Total sales were $\$ 1500$, for which we received a plaque.

Editor and associate editors were chosen soon afterward for our yearbook, the Sagitarrius. These officers were Allen Kast, Bonnie Boger, and Robert Seibert, Respectively. Committees for the various departments were chosen to begin work and gather information immediately.

The Senior Play "Two Gentlemen and Verona" was given on Friday, April 23. This production was under the direction of Mr. Paul Brewster.

On May 15 we were given a Junior-Senior Banquet and Prom at the K of C Home. These occasions were very well attended and very much appreciated by those who did attend.

Baccalaureate was held Sunday, May 23, in the Tell City High School Auditorium. Reverend E. C. Ringer, of Tell City, was the principal speaker.

Monday, May 24, was the Senior Class and Awards Day. The traditional trip to Chicago was taken Tuesday and Wednesday, May 25 , and 26.

Commencement was held May 28, in the Tell City High School Auditorium. Doctor J. A. Raney, Superintendent of the Indiana School for the Deaf was the guest speaker. The TCHS band played the processional and recessional marches as well as other selections throughout the exercises.

The Class colors selected were blue and white; the class flower, the American Beauty Rose, and the class song with the melody, "Till Then".

As we received our diplomas we were all thinking back over our four years of high school; we were reliving our joys and our sorrows, our happy moments and our sad moments. Departing, we leave this message to our underclassmen: "Today Decides Tomorrow."

## MARKSMAN BAND HISTORY
