INTERESTING FACTS ABOUT OUR SCHOOL

Counting the Class of '62, 2,785 people have graduated from Tell City High School. The first class, 1905, had 3 graduates, the largest class, 1961, had 133. Our class is the sixth to pass the 100 mark, in annual graduates.

Grady Swadley is the eighth superintendent of the Tell City Schools, the others being, in order: Glenn Bretz, 1955 to 1958; Fred Fechtman, 1949 to 1955; Napoleon Dixon, 1939 to 1949; Glen Traw, 1934 to 1939; J.S. Turner 1929 to 1934; Charles Hanner 1923 to 1929; and Chris Newman, 1898 to 1923. Hugh Thrasher has been serving as principal of the high school since 1956.

The enrollment in the Tell City School System for the current year is 2146, divided as follows: kindergarten, 141; grades 1 through 8, all three buildings, 1324 high school, 681. The gross per capita cost of all schooling expenses for the current year has been \$193.13 for grade pupils, and \$385.70 for high school pupils. The Tell City School System is composed of 126 people, including 83 teachers, 6 janitors, 2 full time secretaries, 6 substitute teachers, 3 board members, 1 superintendent, four principals, and 13 cafeteria employees. 243 students for the current year have been transfer students. The total operating budget for the current school year has been \$694,585,00.

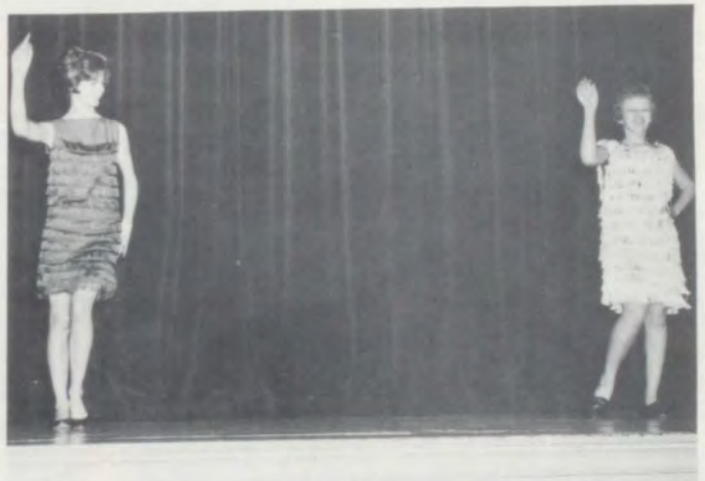
