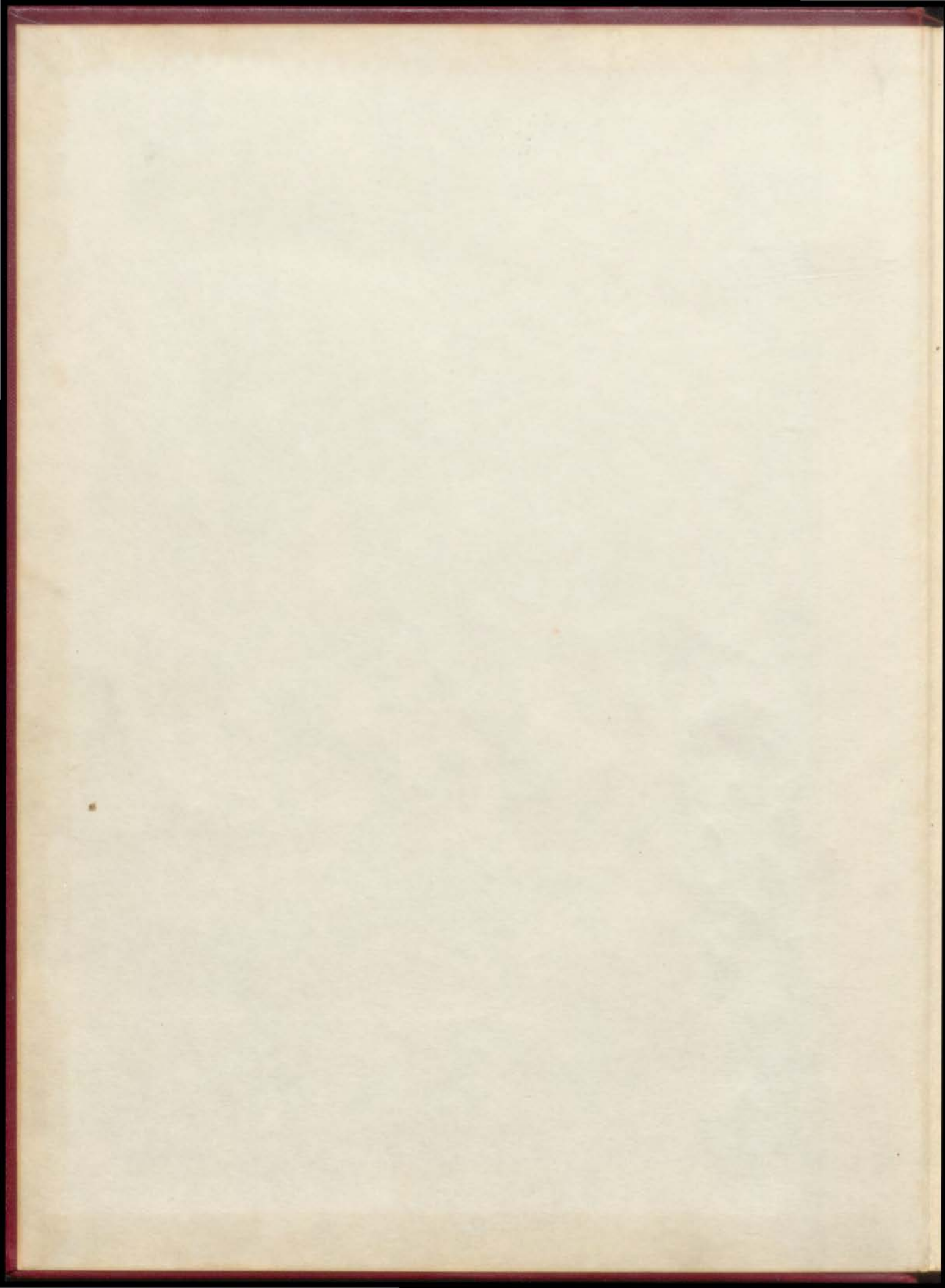




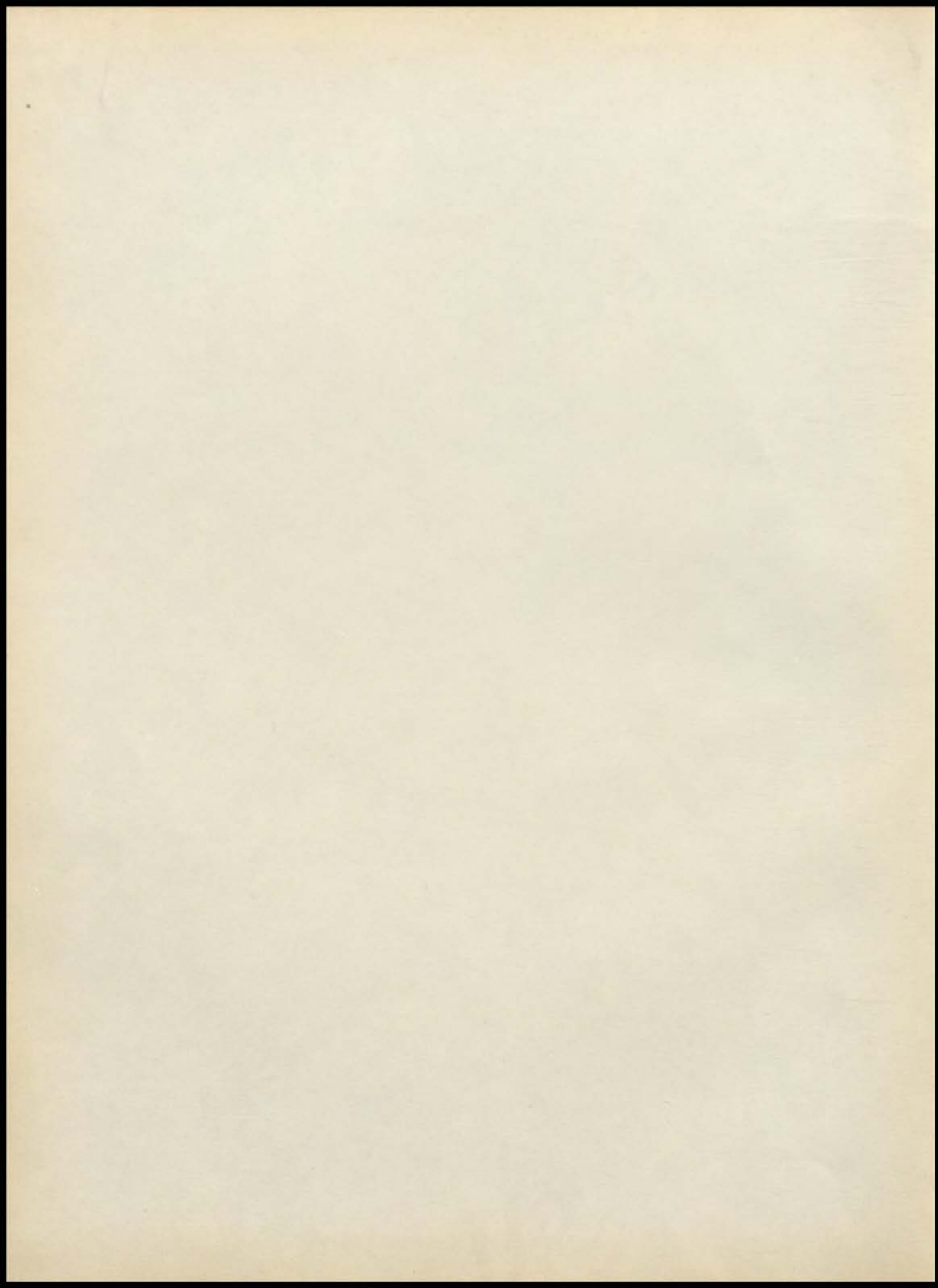

TELL CITY HIGH SCHOOL

A SHORT HISTORY OF TELL CITY HIGH SCHOOL

This year's graduating class brings the total number of graduates from Tell City High School to 3,527.

Sixty-one years ago, the first class--with three graduates--started this procession. At that time, Tell City High School had two teachers--Mr. Chris Newman, superintendent, and Mr. Hardin Whitmarsh, principal.

In the early years, there were few subjects offered, and no choice was given students in selection of courses. All freshmen took geography, government, algebra, grammar, and Latin. All sophomores took algebra, Latin, literature, and physics. All juniors took geometry, Latin, literature and physics, and all seniors took geometry, Latin, literature and botany.

A newspaper clipping from 1906 lists 37 students in the entire four years of high school. At that time, grades earned by each student in each subject were printed in the Tell City News.

The Class of 1905 and Class of 1906 each had 3 graduates, and Class of 1907 and 1916 each had 4. Some of the larger classes have been--1963, 133, 1962, 132, 1961, 128, 1960, 114.

During the first few years, the high school was housed in the Old North Building, which stood where Newman Building does now. From 1909, until 1928, the present Franklin St. building was the high school's home. The new building on 12th Street was occupied in 1928, with additions in 1951 and 1963.

Tell City has had eight superintendents: Chris Newman (1898 to 1923), Charles Hanner (1923 to 1929), J. S. Turner (1929 to 1934), Glen Traw (1934 to 1939), Napoleon Dixon (1939 to 1949), Fred Fechtman (1949 to 1955), Glen Bretz (1955 to 1958) and Grady Swadley (1958).

Hugh Thrasher has been serving as principal of TCHS since 1956.



We respectfully dedicate the 1966 SAGITTARIUS to the memory of Nancy Gayer, a member of the Class of 1966, who departed this life on July 31, 1965, a victim of acute leukemia.

Nancy was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Louis Gayer, a member of the Marksman Band, Order of the Rainbow, Evangelical United Church of Christ, Youth fellowship of her church, and a Candy Stripper at the Perry County Memorial Hospital.

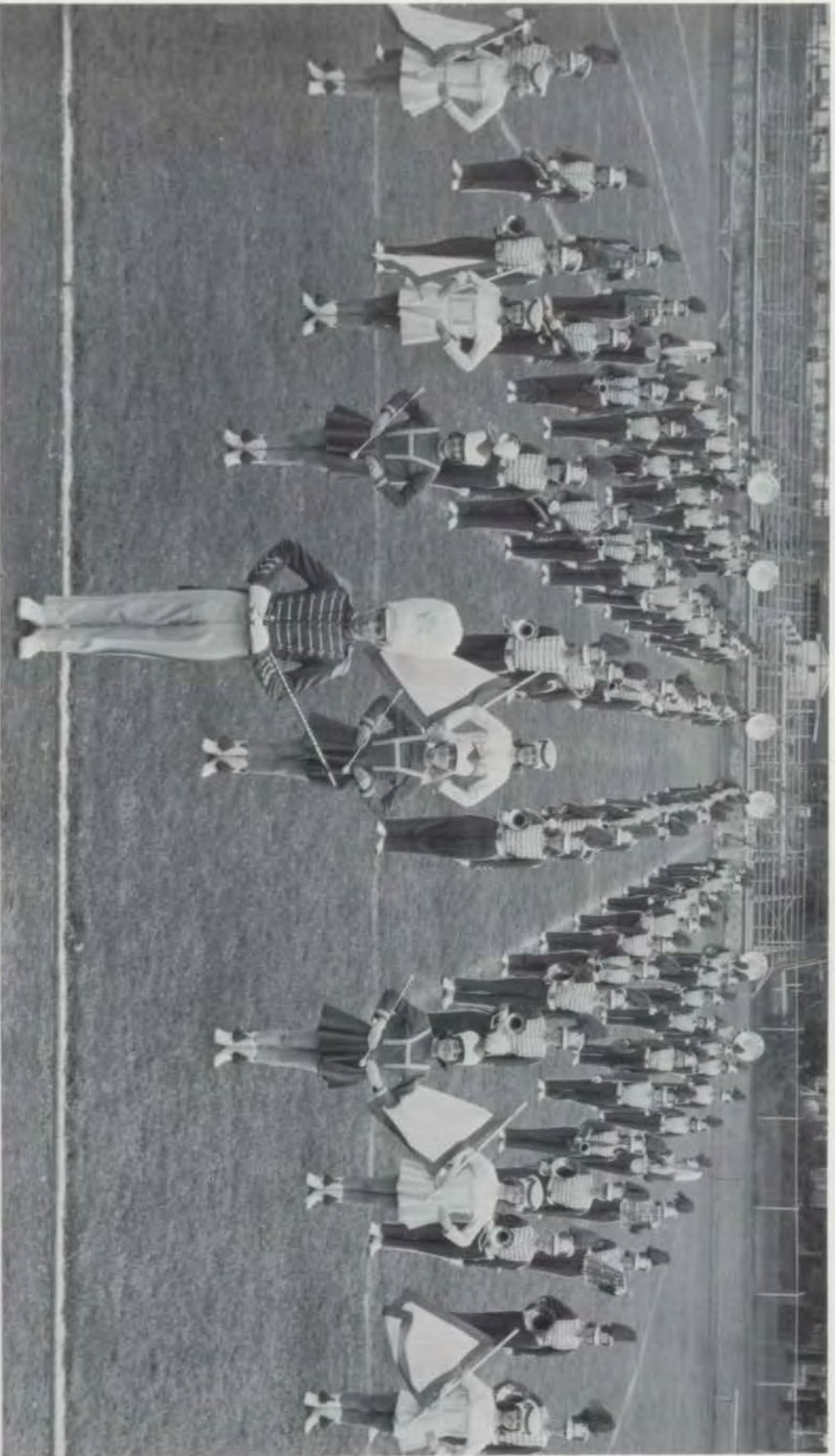
