# Student Council Sponsors Numerous Activities
















# Marksmen Contest

"Nights In White Satin"





The Tell City Marksmen finished their season with a 7-3 record and claimed another SIAC Championship. Although the record might not reveal it, the Marksmen had a tremendous season. The schedule was certainly one of, if not the most difficult ever played at Tell City, according to head coach Joe Talley. One good reason for the season being difficult was the addition of Jeffersonville to the schedule.

Although the Marksmen were defeated by Vincennes, Jeffersonville, and Providence, their potent offense was able to score in every game. The backbone of the offense was built around Pat "Iron Man" Malone who scored 22 touchdowns and also wide receiver Dan Talley who caught 37 passes for seven touchdowns.

The Marksmen had six players who made all-conference. They were Wayne Marchand, Danny Talley, Tim Cail, Randy Arnold and Dennis McGee. Pat Malone received All-State honors from both the AP and UPI coaches poll.










Tell City Wrestlers finished the 1972-73 season with a 6-4 record and placed seventh out of 17 in the SIAC match.
