The Tell City Marksmen finished their season with a $7-3$ record and claimed another SIAC Championship. Although the record might not reveal it, the Marksmen had a tremendous season. The schedule was certainly one of, if not the most difficult ever played at Tell City, according to head coach Joe Talley. One good reason for the season being difficult was the addition of Jeffersonville to the schedule.

Although the Marksmen were defeated by Vincennes, Jeffersonville, and Providence, their potent offense was able to score in every game. The backbone of the offense was built around Pat "Iron Man" Malone who scored 22 touchdowns and also wide receiver Dan Talley who caught 37 passes for seven touchdowns.

The Marksmen had six players who made all-conference. They were Wayne Marchand, Danny Talley, Tim Cail, Randy Arnold and Dennis McGee. Pat Malone received All-State honors from both the AP and UPI coaches poll.

Two wrestlers, Wayne Marchand and Jerry Hagedorn qualified for the regional. Marchand went on to place second in the regional and Coach Pride had this to say about him.
"Wayne had an exceptional year, because with no previous varsity experience he finished 21-2. He had championships in the SIAC and sectional plus a first place finish in the Invitational meet. He was our first SIAC champ and I'm proud of him. He is a competitor."
