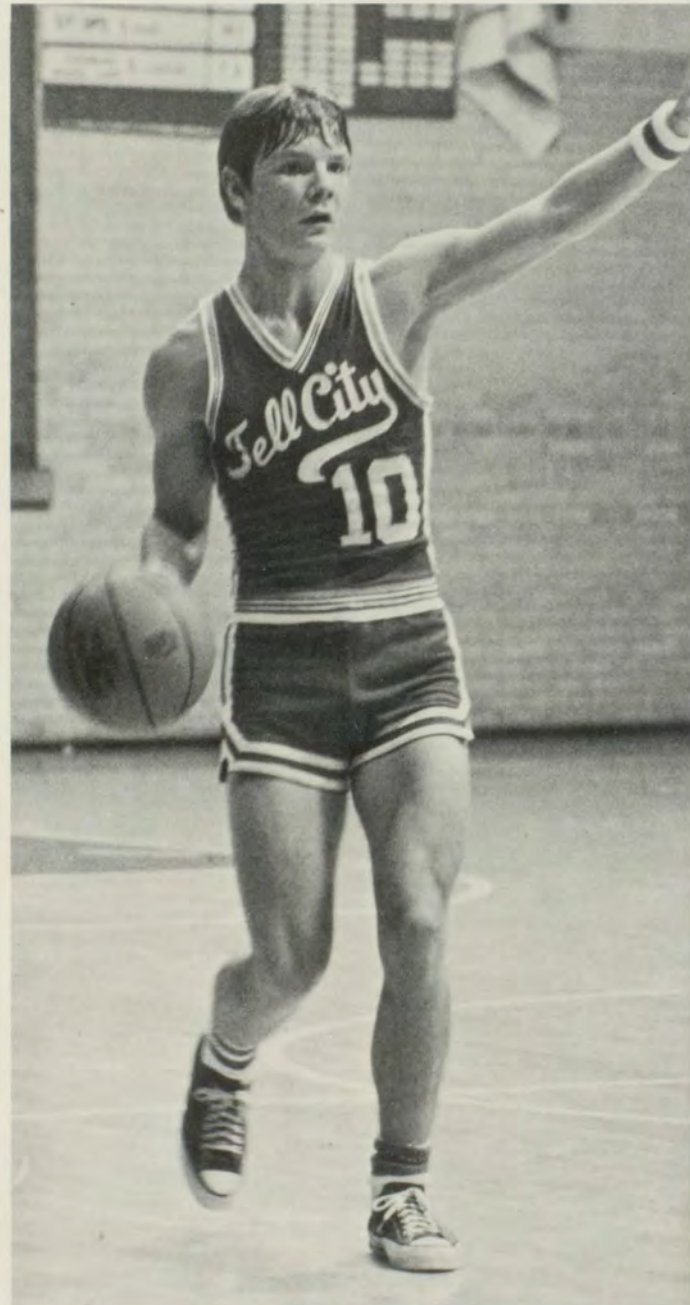

Mr. Roos is an active member of the Evangelical United Church of Christ and spends his spare time working on his farm and raising chinchillas.

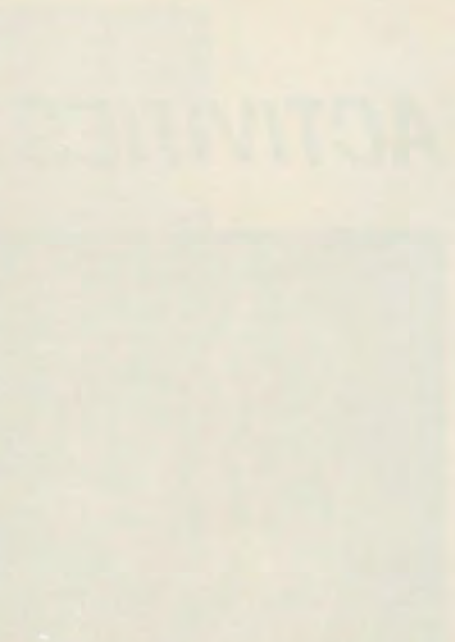

Junior Steve Smith qualified for three events: pole vaulting, low hurdles and high hurdles. Junior Mark Wellman advanced to the regional by placing first in the two mile run. Also placing in the two mile event was sophomore Pat Sweeny. Senior Greg Conner qualified by placing third in the mile run. Tony Fortwendel, senior, advanced in the discus with a throw of 139'4".

Rounding out the list of regional entrants was junior Pat Rhodes. In his best performance ever, Rhodes took second in the long jump with a leap of 21'10". Rhodes was the only cinderman to qualify for the state finals.
