

Our days at Tell City High School are made up of a variety of things. We will always miss TCHS, including the good times and the bad times. It could be the teachers, our







Whom did you go to the Christmas Dance or Prom with? Do you remember the themes of those dances? Do you remember who was crowned King and Queen?










There was a call for rain, but the night turned out to be perfect. Everyone was fired up. The parade started on Main Street and ended at the Legion Field.















From the freshman perspective, Andy Carter stated, "The season was really fun; I just wish we could have had more wins."

















Accomplishing Goals




5 - w a y, p I a c e d third at the Harrison 10 - w a y and placed fifth out of twenty-s e v e n teams at the Holiday Classic.


















The band doesn't only perform in the fall. They also compete in the spring at various concert band contests. They participated in a competition at Columbus High School and recieved a gold rating.










