




















Field of Sports








Above Center: Junior Jamie Brinksneader anticipates the blow of the whistle.


Above Left: Paige Gelarden gets ready to deliver a serve.

Above Right: Senior Katie Kalin and junior Leslie Poole eagerly chase after the ball. The Marksmen went on to claim victory.







TCHS also put on a homecoming dance after the football game against Southridge. This dance was a huge success. Many of the students attended the dance and had a terrific time.













One Step, Two Step, Run, Run, Run








on. They may have fallen short of their major goal, reaching the semi-state, but they still managed to stay competitive in every meet despite having a very inexperienced quad.


















Batter, Batter, What's the Matter?

The wonderful memories come and go, But the spirit will always show.








Hooray for Retirement Day!
