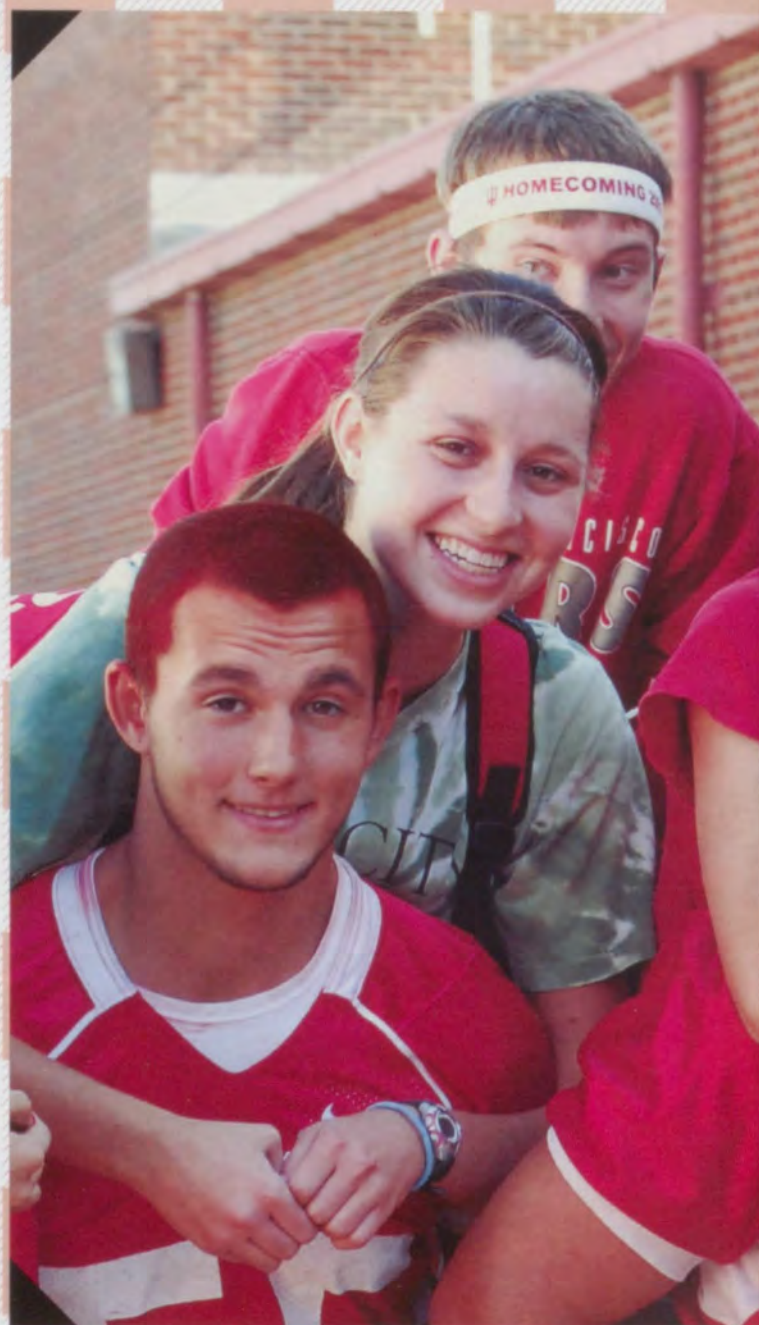

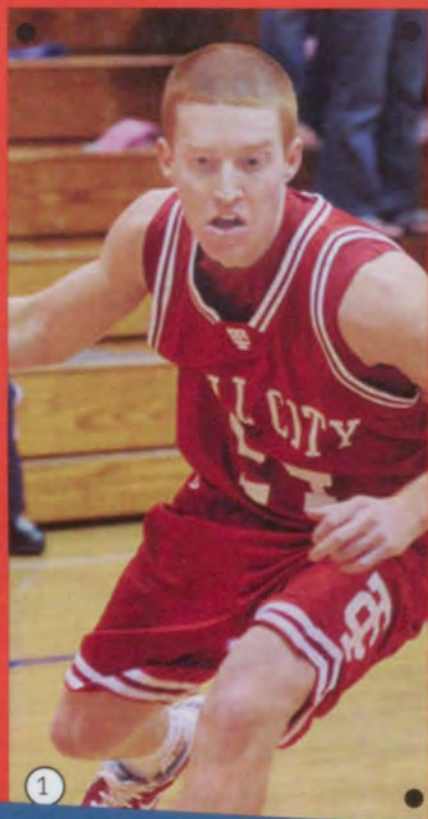

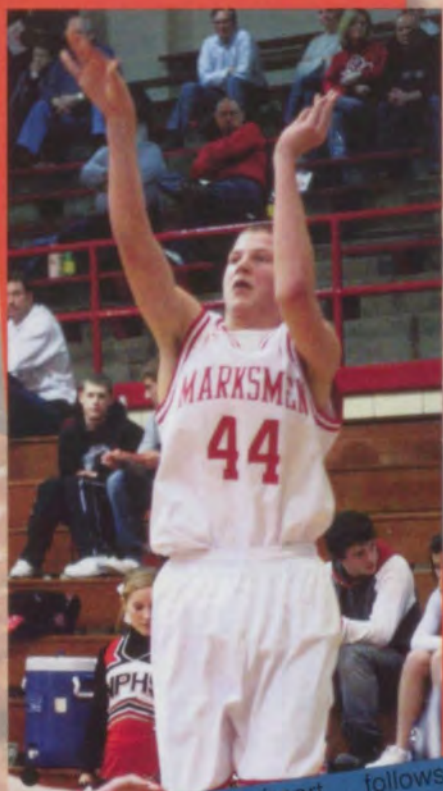

Hayes broke two records this season including the most blocks in a season and the season rebound average.

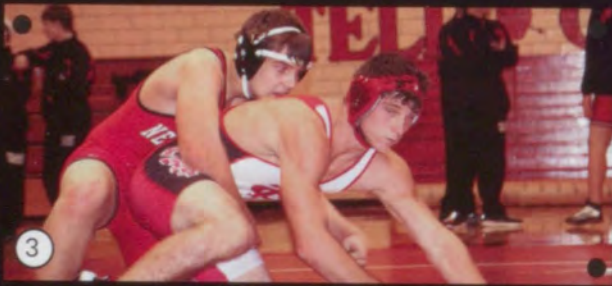
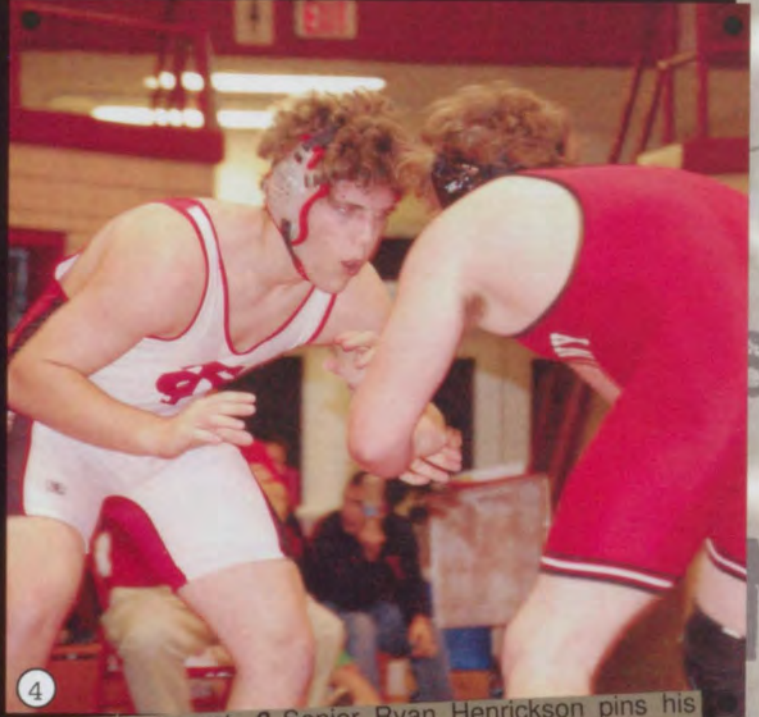

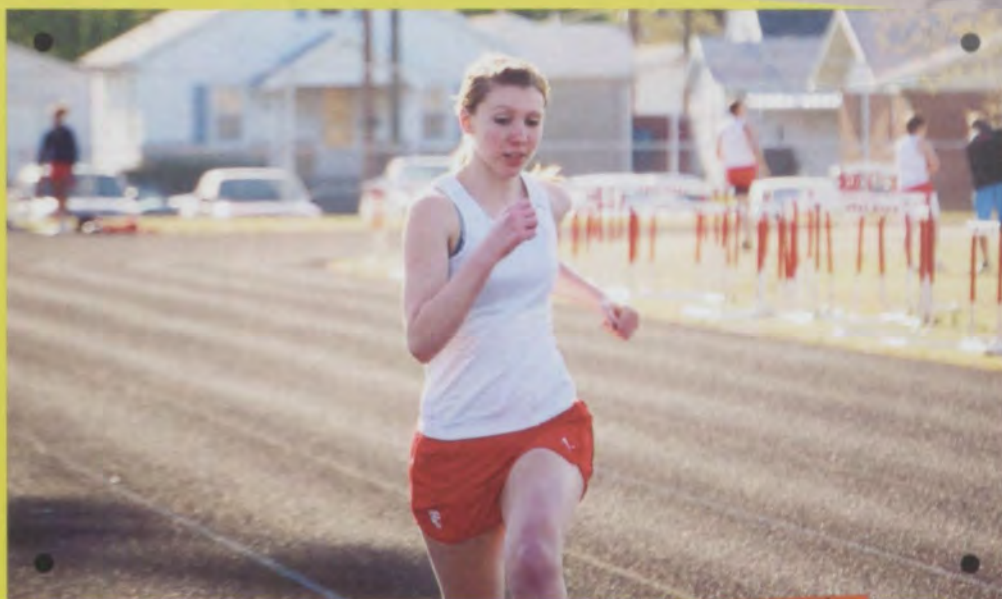

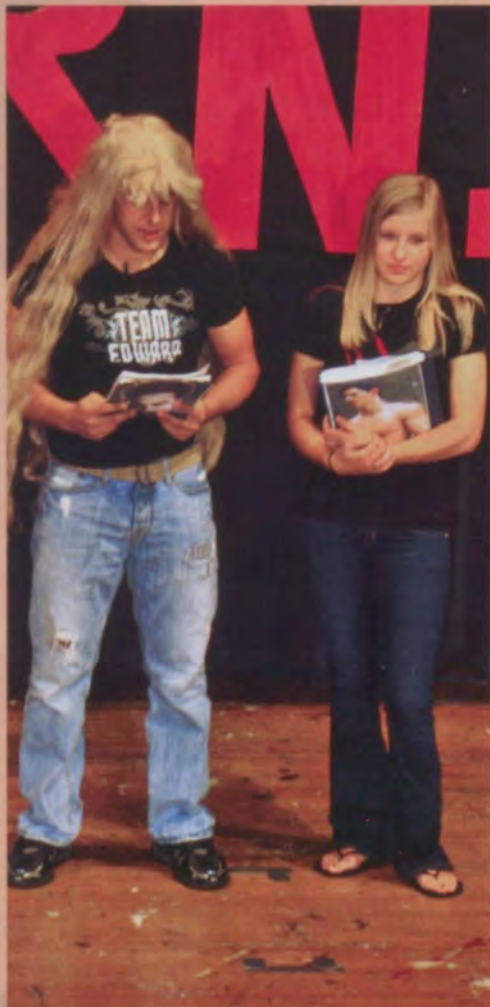

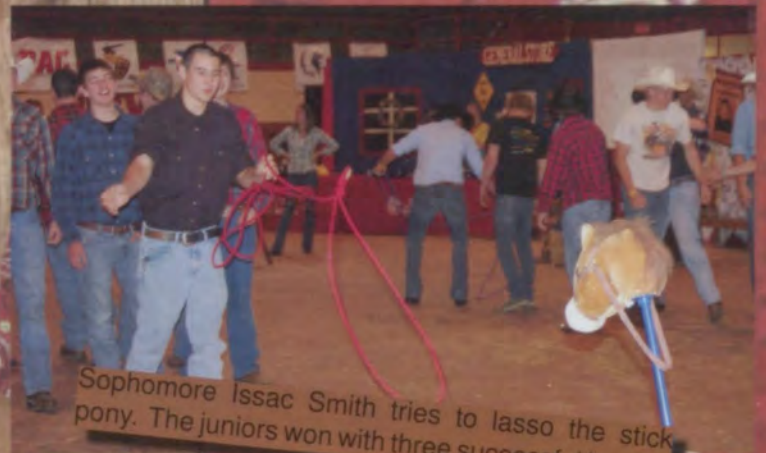

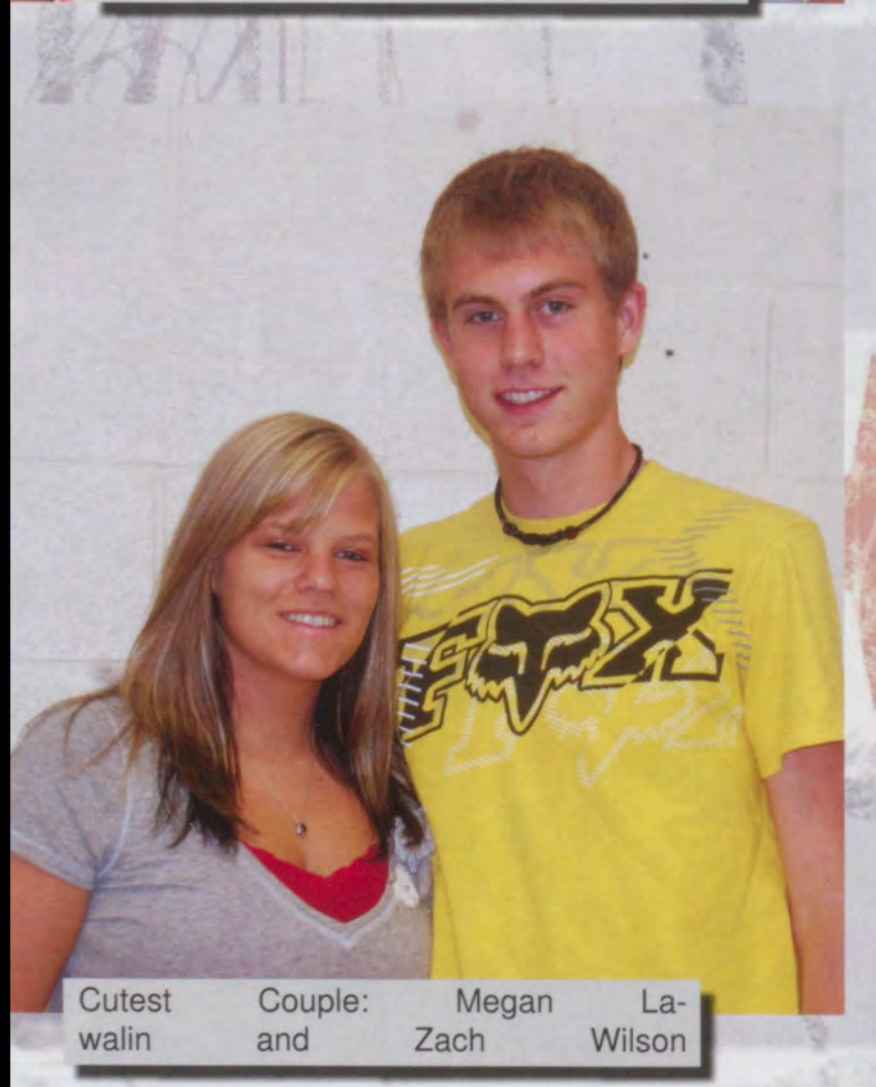

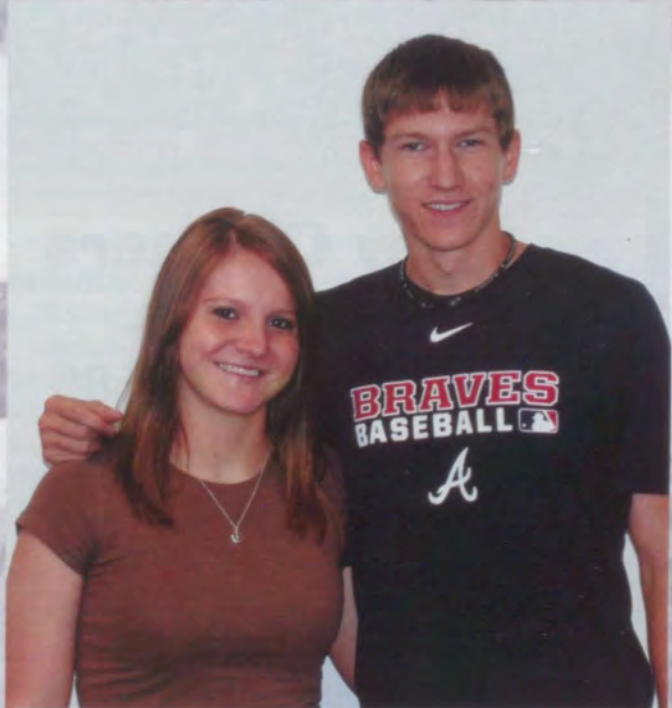
