





#### Mr. Efienne Superintendant


Mr. Etienne started working at Tell City High School in January of 2005. His favorite part of working here has been seeing the positive changes that have been made.










The volleyball girls had a successful team this year. The team was led by the two seniors: Miranda Zuelly and Cassidy Barnhill.





Freshman Kayla Morrow said, "This was my first year playing, and overall we had a good season."








The Marksmen had an overall good season. They finished their season with only 7 out of 13 boys. Each one stepped up and did what was needed to be done.









Overall, the Kick-Off was a success. It was very well received by the students, staff, and community.





Many of the students received prizes for their achievements, including Top Ten and Honor Roll. Over 200 of the highly coveted t-shirts were given out.





Students played various games to win tickets so they could try for the iPad, 27" television, or the gas cards that were donated by local businesses. It was all a big success.






