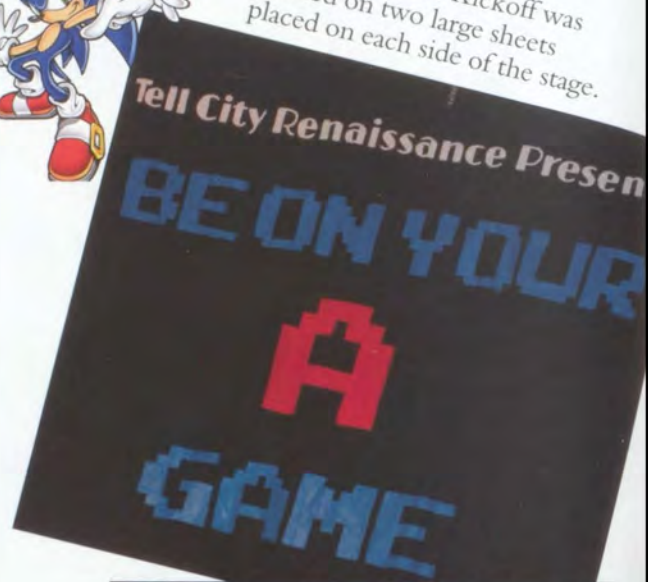


The logo for the Kickoff was painted on two large sheets placed on each side of the stage.

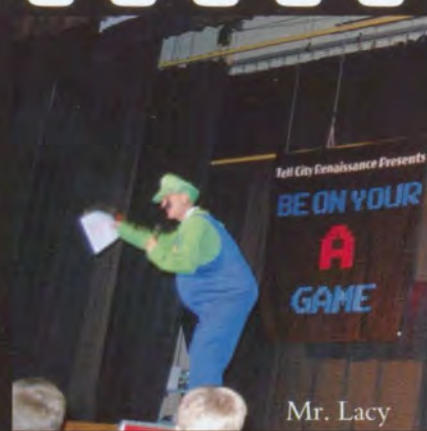

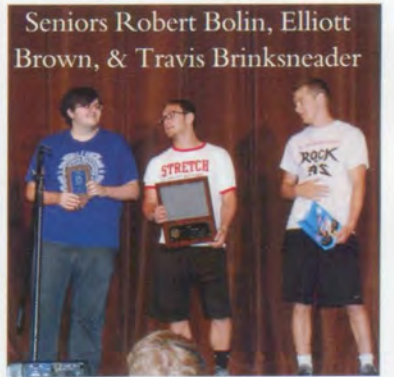

The set design was amazing, with over 1,800 balloons total. Some were used for the rainbow and some were dropped from the balcony.

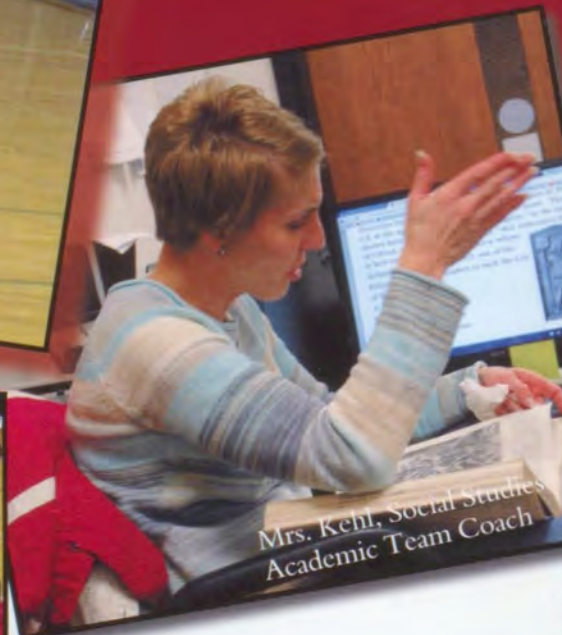

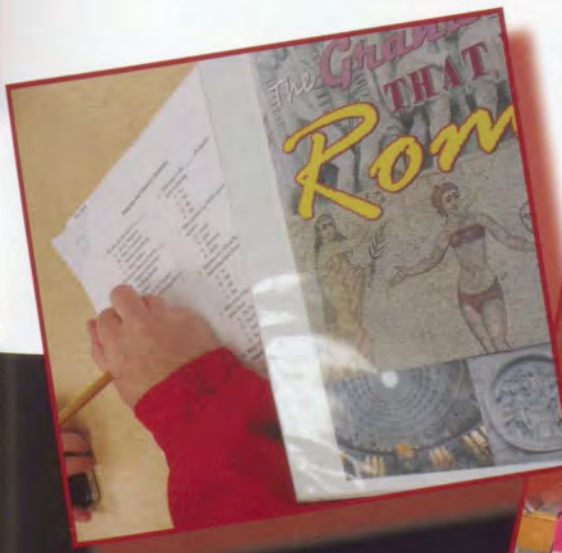

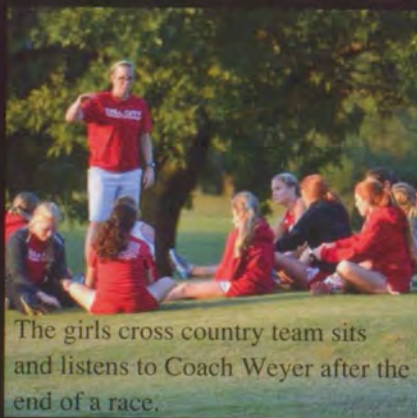

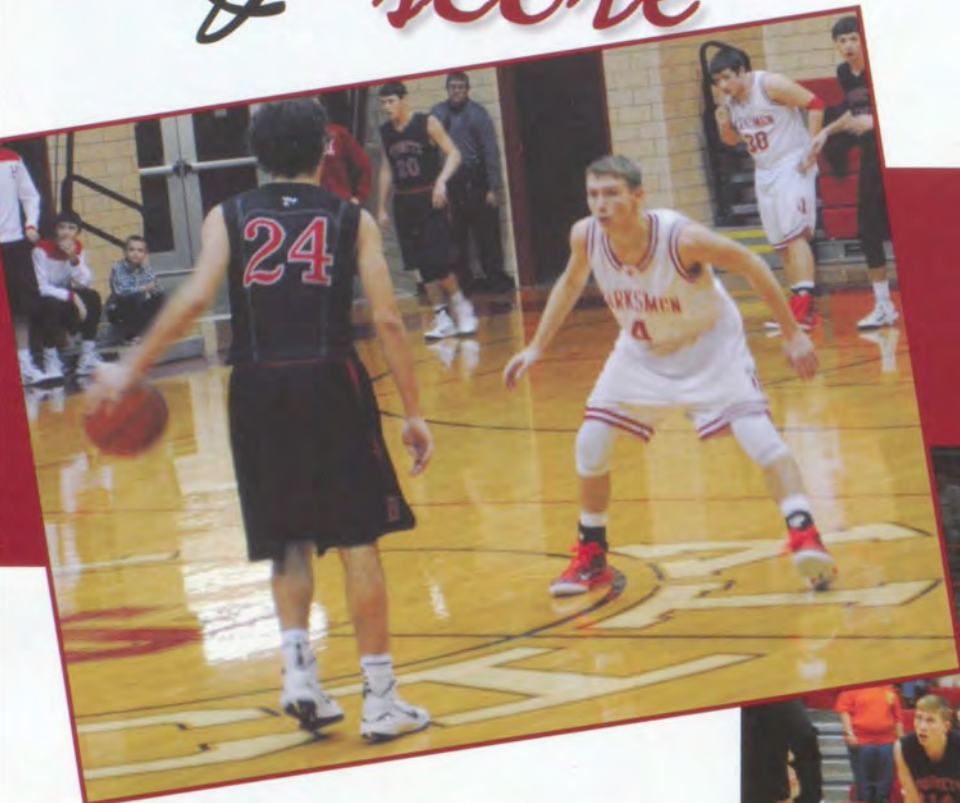

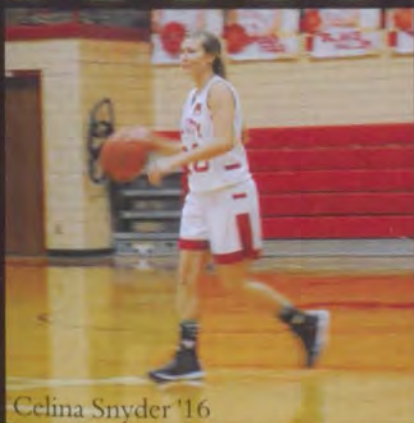
