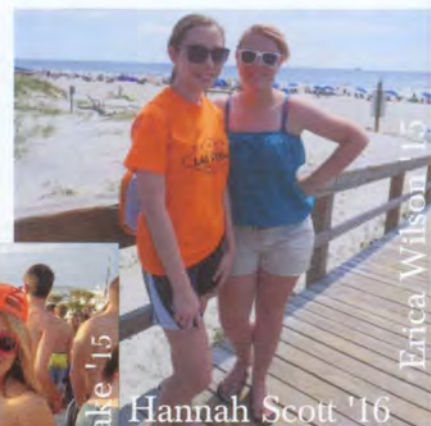

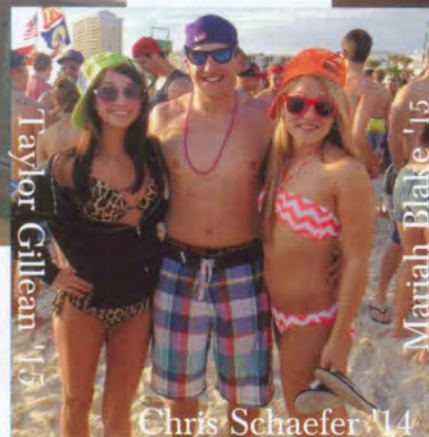

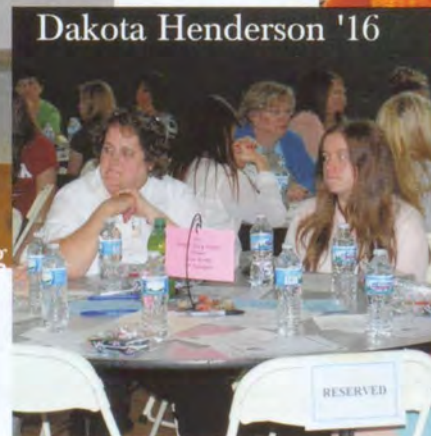

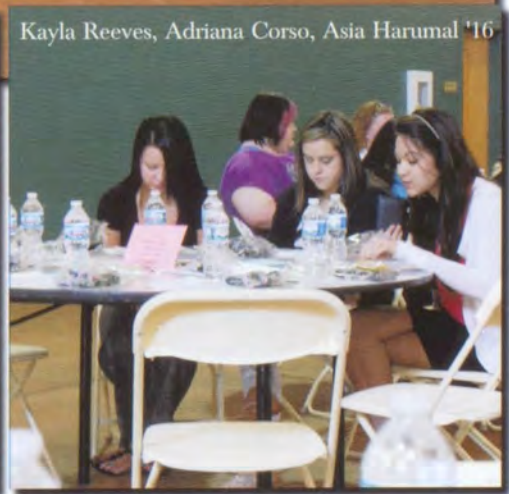

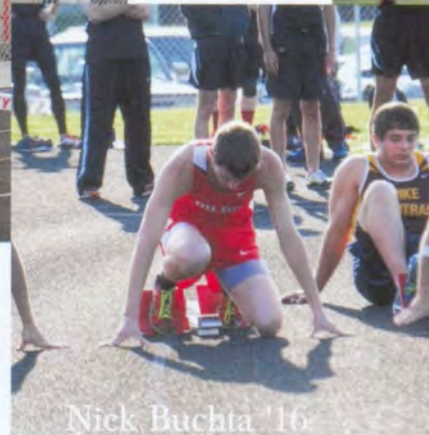

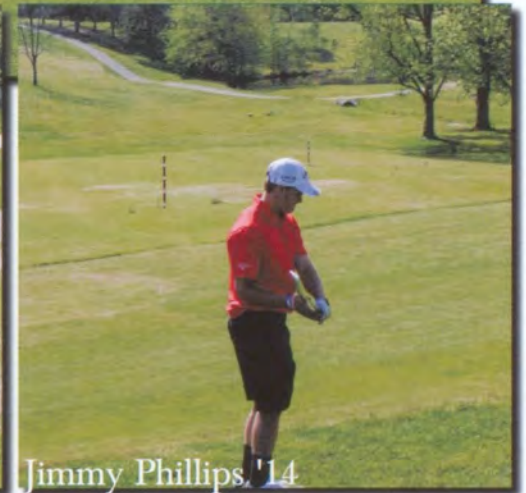

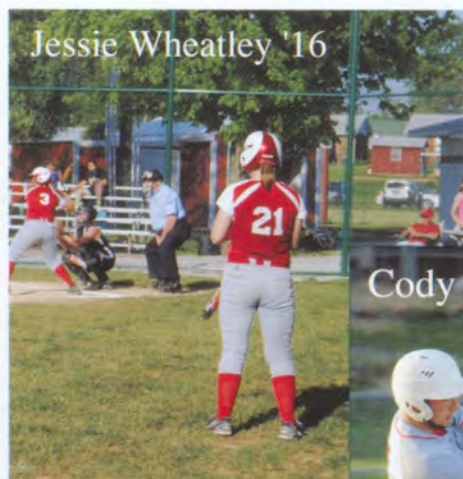
# From 43 Feet to 60 Feet, 6 Inches

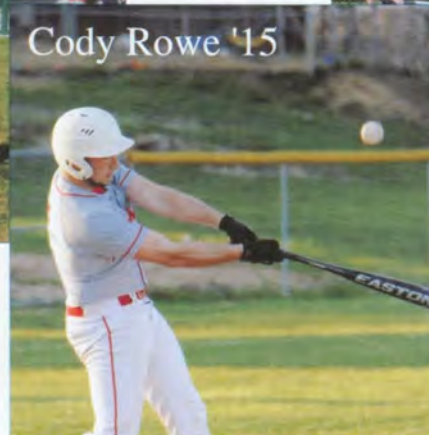

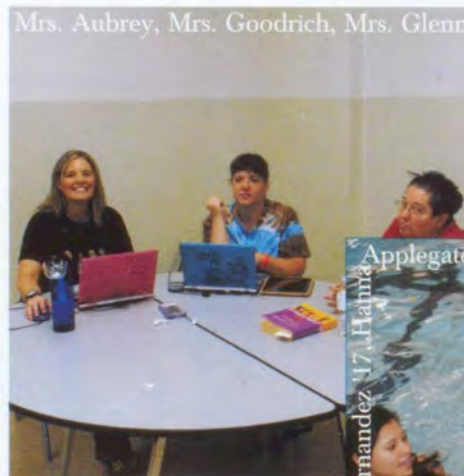


# From Boats to Board Games

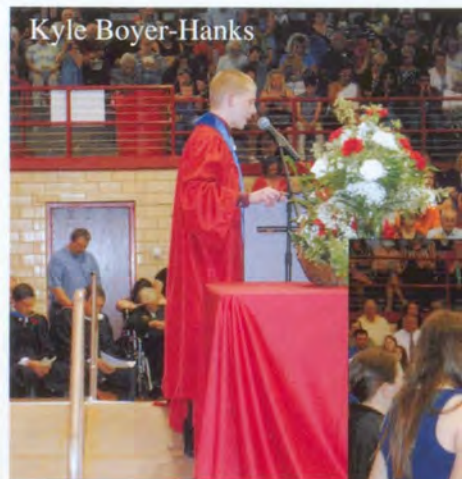
# We are the Marksmen

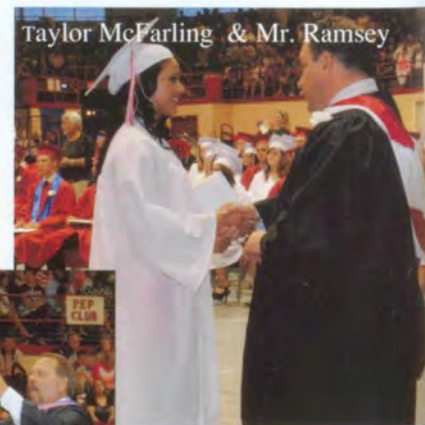
